

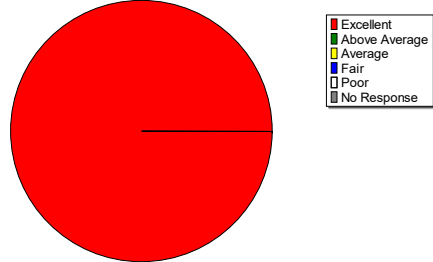

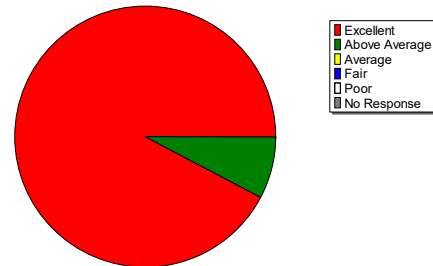

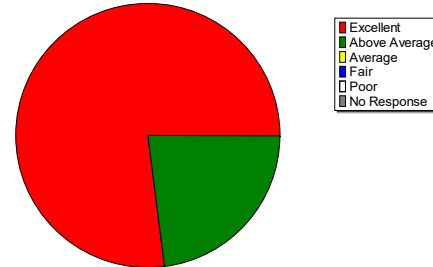
How would you rate your instructor's preparation for the school/course?

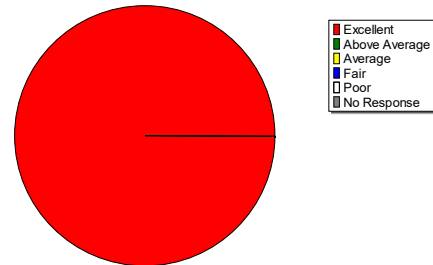
How would you describe your instructor's organizational skills?

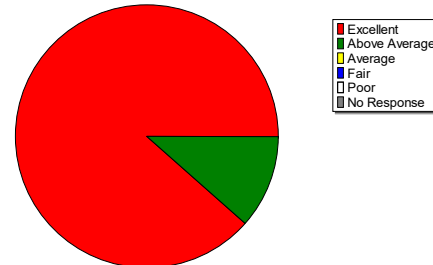
How would you describe your instructor's knowledge of the subject?

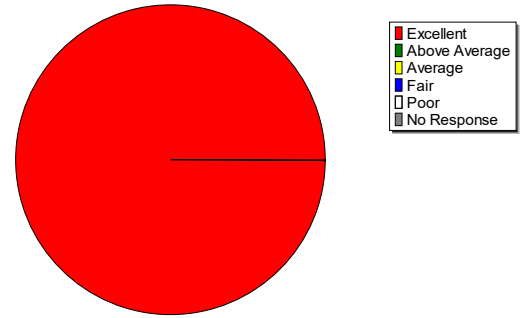
How would you describe your instructor's ability to communicate?

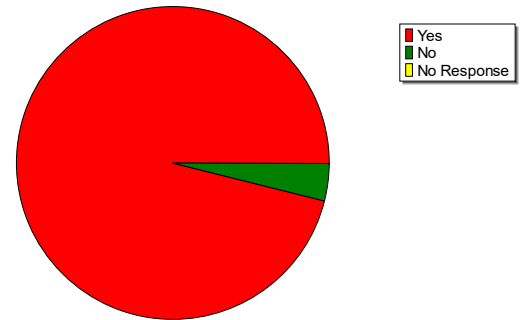
What is your overall rating of the school/course?

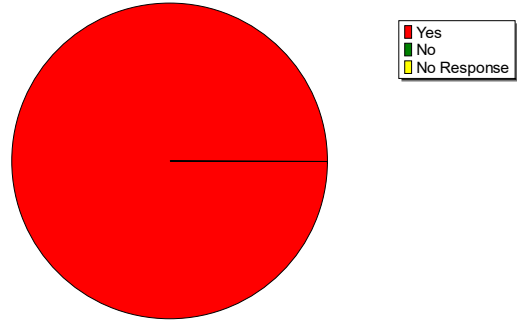


Please explain:

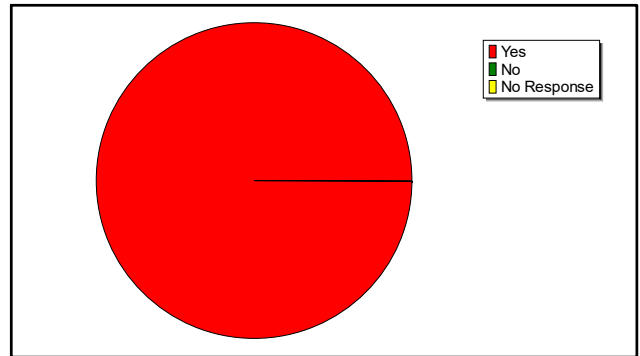


Please explain:

- My only suggestion would be to repeat often in the classroom setting that what is being presented in the classroom is overwhelming but not to be concerned because once in the field everything will from the classroom will become clearer once begin the practical portion.

- Like I said earlier the instructors were absolutely fantastic. Probably the best overall out of any TEEX course I have taken. Some areas of opportunity from my perspective; Handouts of the Friday night power point presentation. There was a lot to take in and some great rule of thumb numbers and having them pre printed to follow or just add side notes. We did have one handout sheet with the crib info which was excellent. Also there was a playbook for Dallas FD that was mentioned and if there was a link or way to access it, it could be a lot of help with post course study. Some diagrams and pictures or use of the dry erase board at the first night lecture as a visual aid to the verbal instruction. Like they say, a picture is worth a thousand words. In Friday nights class they mentioned beveling the step chocks, but I didn't see any in use or a picture as an example. The struts and strut lifts were great pieces of gear. Talking to my other volunteer and small station peers I noted that most of our departments don't have them. One team did use air bags in one of the exercises, but maybe another example using what small stations have available might have more impact to us immediately. I'm sure that we all will be asking our departments to get more equipment as a result of the class. It was mentioned that in a class in South America that they used some long 4x4's to make due, and also used some bolts in combination. Again, a picture is worth a thousand words. If possible, some email contact info for our instructors would be a bonus if questions popped into our minds at a later time. I know after I got home and got some sleep after class I thought of a lot more questions to ask. Once again I can't say enough good things about the instructors and the course. We were able to get plenty of hands on time on the tools and learn at a good pace. Doing the quick picks were good too for a little pressure, after we had already practiced the procedures.
- Only the hosting department got to see the air bag demonstrations, I would have liked to have seen it too.
